Early years

A special online safety episode of Play School to watch with young children, developed by the ABC and eSafety. Episode teaching notes and follow up ideas are also available.

[Online safety teaching posters](#)

The pictures on each poster help explain four key messages to young children: Be safe, Be kind, Ask for help and Make good choices. They can relate the pictures to what they do at home or with their friends, providing opportunities to discuss online safety.

These engaging animated videos are supported by lesson plans and worksheets, offering children practical guidance on staying safe and managing risks online.

The resources explore critical thinking, device safety, protecting privacy, spending money online and getting help and support.

These teacher-led activities use animated videos to introduce primary school students to key online safety issues including the risks of sharing images, protecting personal information and cyberbullying.
