These notes support eSafety’s Virtual Classroom webinar, ‘**Be an eSafe kid: Back to school – pack your online safety toolkit!**’.

The webinar is designed to help students understand how to navigate online friendships using the skills of respect, responsibility and getting help and support. Students will discover the key social skills they need to pack into their online safety toolkit, and how to apply these skills when communicating online.



About the webinar

As part of an integrated online safety program, this webinar can be used to check knowledge and support conversations with students and their families. It aligns with the Australian Curriculum in the key learning areas of Digital Technologies, Health and Physical Education, Humanities and Social Sciences and English.

Joining the webinar

Join the webinar through the link sent in your registration email. Please log on at least 10 minutes before the session. You will be asked how many students will be attending in your learning space. It is preferable for each learning space to have its own registration. The webinar will run for approximately 40 minutes.

Students can participate by:

- listening to the presenter
- recording answers to the questions on the worksheet (optional)
- responding to the teacher-facilitated discussions (use the webinar chat box to record and share the students’ answers)
- taking their worksheets home and sharing their learning with their parents and carers.
